

2018 Census results


The 2018 New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings was held on 6 March 2018. This is the official count by Stats NZ of how many people and dwellings there are in New Zealand.

This information sheet provides an overview of initial results from the census for people in the broad MELAA category. This includes people of Middle Eastern, Latin American and African ethnicities. Ethnicity is self-perceived, and a person can be part of more than one ethnic group.

MELAA are a small but fastgrowing group

At the 2018 Census there were 35,838 usual residents in Auckland who were in the broad MELAA category (2.3% of Auckland's population) – an increase of 10,893 people, or 43.7%, since the 2013 Census. The MELAA population has grown more rapidly than the wider Auckland population.



The MELAA group is diverse

MELAA is one of the most diverse ethnic categories. The largest group (47.7%) identify with a Middle Eastern ethnicity.

At a finer level of detail, there are 48 distinct ethnicities defined under MELAA. The four largest sub-groups are shown below.

MELAA Level 4 Ethnic Groups, 2018 Census (Those with percentage ≥ 5% in Auckland)

Half (51%) of those in the broad MELAA category in New Zealand live in Auckland. Almost two thirds (61.1%) of all NZ usual residents who identify with a Middle Eastern ethnicity live in Auckland.

MELAA are the smallest ethnic group in Auckland

MELAA represent 2.3% of the Auckland population, up from 1.9% at the 2013 Census.


Across Auckland's 21 local board areas, Waitematā (4.7%) and Puketāpapa (3.5%) have the largest proportion of usual residents who are in the broad MELAA category.

The maps below show the number of the usually resident population in Auckland's 21 local board areas who identify with a MELAA ethnicity, over time. There has been an increase in all local board areas, particularly in Waitematā.

Number of local board population identifying with a MELAA ethnicity (2006, 2013 and 2018)




Auckland's MELAA population has a high proportion of young adults

As the age/sex chart shows below, at the 2018 Census, a third (33.6%) of the MELAA population in Auckland was aged between 25 and 39 years, up from 28.9% in 2013.

During that time there was a decrease in the proportion aged 15 to 24 years (17.3% in 2013 and 13.9% in 2018).

In 2018, a relatively small proportion (4.3%) were aged 65 years or older, compared to 12.2% of the rest of Auckland's population.



At the 2018 Census, the median age of the MELAA population in Auckland was 30.6 years, compared with 34.7 years overall in Auckland. MELAA females (30.6 years) have a lower median age than MELAA males (31.0 years).

A note on data sources

In response to issues with the 2018 Census, Stats NZ has, for the first time, used administrative and other data to help fill gaps caused by response rates that were lower than anticipated.
