will be applied to the stump.

# YOUR PROPERTY QUALIFIES FOR NO-COST WEED CONTROL

Due to the ecological values in and around your neighbourhood, you are eligible for no-cost control of climbing asparagus, bushy asparagus, ginger, moth plant, woolly nightshade and rhamnus. When residents or landowners book this control, staff will control target pest plants using best practice and at no cost to yourself, regardless of the quantity of the pest plant present.
